

POINTS FOR DISCUSSION

Immediate Objectives

1. Letter from Minister Prentice to the Haudenosaunee Confederacy (the Confederacy) dealing with the Haldimand Tract land rights and committing the federal government to appoint a representative to resolve of outstanding issues through a new lands process for Six Nations. The letter must contain assurances that the federal government will not deploy the Canadian Armed Forces to the Douglas Creek lands.
2. Steps to be taken to drop all criminal charges stemming from the OPP intervention of April 20th, 2006.
3. The imposition of an immediate moratorium halting any development on the Douglas Creek lands for a period of time to be agreed upon by the representatives of the Confederacy, Canada and Ontario (the parties). During the moratorium the parties agree to establish a process to deal with the Douglas Creek land rights.

Short-term Objectives

4. The parties agree to:
 - a) To review the Archaeological report prepared for Henco related to the Douglas Creek lands;
 - b) To consult with appropriate Ontario government officials about the current legislation, e.g. Cemeteries Act, relevant regulations and approval processes pertaining to the report;
 - c) To pursue additional archaeological work to confirm the status of any burial sites.
5. To address any rumours and misinformation by providing detailed updates by all parties.
6. To address issues of transparency with regard to compensation provided by Ontario to Henco.
7. The parties commit to an exploration of how aboriginal people are represented in the educational curriculum and to formulate options and processes to address concerns pertaining to curriculum and other appropriate matters.
